

5th Annual Fort Collins Book Fest We're Going Virtual!

The Fort Collins Book Fest is celebrating our first 5 years with a digital hybrid of interviews, book talks, readings, panels, and writing workshops. Sessions will be centered around craft brewing, music, food, the outdoors, and science and technology. Participants will have the opportunity to engage in live Q&A with many of the speakers.



First weekend -October 9-11

The festival kicks off on Friday, October 9 at 10:00 AM with the first of four writing workshops. During the lunch hour on Friday, join author and gardener Jennifer Jewell for her talk on Cultivating Place, along with a virtual tour of the Gardens on Spring Creek.

For happy hour on Friday, crack

open a brew or two for a guided beer-tasting and interview with Garrett Oliver, author of The Brewmaster's Table and head brewer at Brooklyn Brewery. Then wrap up the evening with readings from poets Juan Morales, Camille Dungy, and hip hop artist Boss Eagle.

Saturday includes another writing workshop in the morning, an interview with Mohammed Noor (Live Long and Evolve) about the science behind Star Trek, a discussion on farming in the black community with Soul Fire Farm, and breakbeat poetry from Idris Goodwin. Then, join us from home for a free film screening of The Biggest Little Farm.

To close the first weekend, you'll have a chance to meet the bison herd at Soapstone Natural Area and learn about its establishment with a presentation from Dr. Jennifer Barfield on Sunday.

The free literary festival will take place over two weekends, October 9-11 and 16-18 and can be enjoyed from your own home. Sessions will be available through the Fort Collins Book Fest website (www.FoCoBookFest.org) and streaming on the Library District's Facebook page.

The festival draws local, national, and international talent and is headlined this year

by music legend Judy Collins, author of Judy Blue Eyes: My Life in Music. She is joined by Colorado Poet Laureate Bobby LeFebre, featured authors Fred Pearce (When the Rivers Run Dry), John Fielder (Colorado's Highest: The History of Naming the 14,000-Foot Peaks), and others.


