AUTOMATIC RENEWALS ARE HERE!

You can cross “renew library books” off your To-Do list. We’re excited to provide automatic renewals for all cardholders.

Library materials checked out on your account will attempt to renew automatically one day prior to the due date. Each auto-renewal gives you an additional loan period to enjoy your books, DVDs, or other items. No need to click “renew” in your library account or call the Answer Center to get more time.

How does automatic renewal work?

The day before your item is due, our system will try to automatically renew it. You will receive an email letting you know which items were renewed and which items are still due.

If successful, your loan will be extended from the existing due date. Renewal periods will be the same length as the original loan period. If unsuccessful, you will continue to receive notices about overdue items.

Will everything automatically renew?

Most physical items are eligible for automatic renewals. However, an item will not auto-renew if another library customer has requested it (placed it on hold) or the item has reached its maximum number of renewals (up to 3 for most items).

Some library materials are not eligible for auto-renewal including

- Interlibrary Loans
- Here & Now Collection
- Lucky Day Collection
- Some Gadgets & Things items
- Select Prospector/MOBIUS items
- Digital downloaded content from Libby, hoopla and similar services

Library accounts that are blocked due to excessive fees or other issues are not eligible for auto-renewals. Please contact the Answer Center at (970) 221-6740 for assistance if your account is blocked.

To make sure that you receive important reminders and notifications, check that your email address is current in your online account (“My Account”) or add an email address using the “Edit Account” button. You can also review and update your email by calling the Answer Center or visiting the library for assistance.

At this time, SMS text notices cannot include information about auto-renewals. If you use Text Alerts, you will need to call the Answer Center or log in to your account to check due dates and auto-renewals.

NEW LAPTOP-LENDING KIOSK AT OLD TOWN LIBRARY

The Library's newest tech addition – a Laptop-Lending Kiosk – is up and running at Old Town Library. The kiosk adds 12 laptops to the existing 15 desktop computers available in the 2nd floor computer lab.

Laptop checkouts are self-serve using your All Access Library Card number and 4-digit PIN. Laptops are only available for in-library use and provide users with computer access for up to two hours per day.

Each laptop is equipped with Microsoft Suite programs, and internet and print connectivity. The devices also include a HDMI port, USB ports, and Aux-in for headphones. They work anywhere inside the library including study and meeting rooms and independent work areas, and they do not require power or connecting cords.

After laptops are returned to the kiosk, all user information and data is deleted to protect your privacy and the device is recharged.

2023 NEWSPAPERS & DELIBERATIVE JOURNALISM PROJECT

It's been nearly a year since the Deliberative Journalism Project (DJP) launched its initial series of conversations around local news and reimagining local journalism. Poudre Libraries has been a proud part of this initiative—led by CSU Center for Public Deliberation, Fort Collins *Coloradoan*, and other community organizations. Its work highlights local issues, combats misinformation, and engages the community.

As part of the DJP team, the Library hosts the monthly discussion program, "The Scoop," at Old Town Library which features relevant topics to news and issues around Northern Colorado. Past discussions have included ranked-choice voting and bridging the political divide.

This year, DJP will focus many of its community discussions on housing and the various issues that affect housing, affordability, and growth in Northern Colorado. We invite you to join us by signing up for and attending The Scoop program each month. Did you know that your library card gives you free daily access to *The Denver Post*, *Fort Collins Coloradoan*, *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal* and *Washington Post*?

The Library's online news databases include Newspaper Source Plus, Proquest News, America's News, Hispanic Life in America, and Colorado Historic Newspaper Collection. These resources provide access to thousands of full-text newspapers, articles, columns, and newswires as well as many news archives.

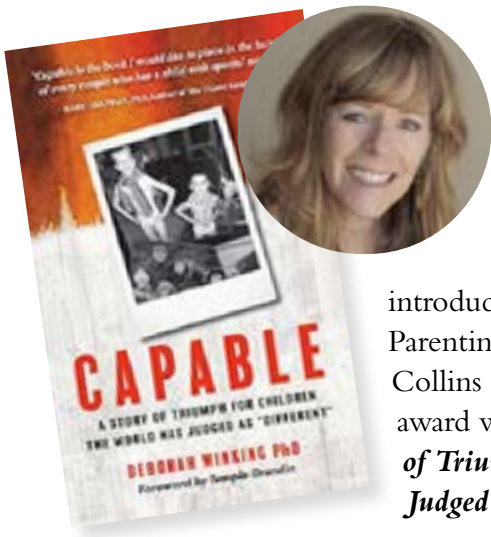
